

#### Important Notice all 55,56,57 Club members

With HVRS & CVS Concessional registration schemes

We have noticed lately that there have been quite a few members not addressing their renewal of RMS Permits for registration until they are close to or overdue.

It would be remiss of us not to let you know if you drive your car after the due date that you are driving an unlicensed vehicle and there for liable for a fine if you are caught.

The RMS sends out renewal notice's one month before the due date and a notice of cancelation one month after that date so the responsibility is all on the operator (Owner) of the vehicle the correct original form (HVRS 1259) or (CVS1835) these must be dated 2019.

You are encouraged to obtain your pink slip well before the due date of your registration and once done it has an expiry use by date of 42 days after the date of issue,

So, it makes sense that you get prepared early for the renewal. Once you receive the renewal notice proceed to get your pink slip ASAP.

This gives you time if there are any repairs are needed, then TYPE in the left side of your original Historic 1259 or for Classic vehicle 1835, with your renewal notice and make arrangements with one of our plate registrars for a suitable time for them to sign off and apply the club stamp and signature. Or make arrangements to see one of them at our club meetings.

Once this is done for **Historic** vehicle's you now only have to go to the RMS with the 1259 form and the original pink slip and pay the due fee.

For **Classic Vehicle Scheme** you need to post the original 1835 form to the ACMC, or you can scan it and send it after its been filled in along with a copy of your pink slip (do not send the original pink slip you will need this when going to RMS to renew registration) and enclose a payment of \$25 by cheque or electronic transfer (no cash payment to be sent in post) to.

Attention the Secretary ACMC; Mr Terry Thompson; Postal address; PO box 419 Bexley 2207. Banking details **Account number 157 374 299 BSB 633-108** and wait for ACMC return mail it should take around 5-7 days. If you don't receive it within 10 days please contact the plate's registrar as the ACMC will not notify you if there is anything wrong.

We repeat (do not send the original pink slip you will need this when going to RMS to renew registration). Then go to the RMS and pay the due fee.



#### Chevrolet - More than Just a Name

On the morning of June 6 1941, in Detroit, Michigan, a man whose name was emblazoned on more than seventeen million automobiles died in almost complete obscurity. And, if not in poverty, at least in extremely modest circumstances

considering the wealth of his name-sake company.

Louis Chevrolet, inventor, automobile designer, speed equipment manufacturer and a very accomplished racing driver, was laid to rest in Indianapolis not too far from the famed brickyard, scene of two of his personal racing triumphs. Mourned by personal friends, paid brief passing tribute by the Detroit newspapers, many people were reminded by his death and of his association with the Chevrolet automobile since 1911.

Born in 1878 in Switzerland, Louis showed a mechanical gift, and at an early age began tinkering and inventing. His first invention was a wine-barrel pump designed to lift the clear wine out of its ageing cask and leave the undesirable dregs undisturbed.

Later on he built, patterned on his own prototype, fast racing bicycles. Fascinated by the sight of an early automobile, he moved to France and went to work for an auto manufacturer, coming to the U.S.A. as a representative for this concern in 1900.

Today, Louis Chevrolet would have been labelled a "hot rodder" or a "street machiner". He liked speed and could coax more power out of an engine than most of his contemporaries, so it was natural for him to turn to racing. His career, from 1905 to 1920 was distinguished by his hard and heady driving.

Louis and Arthur Chevrolet in Louis' Frontenac racing cars qualified in the 1916 Indianapolis, and Louis challenged the leader very hard but dropped out with a burnt rod. In the following year, Louis and his other brother, Gaston were back with new cars and Louis duelled for the lead in the first half of this 500 mile event. A steering knuckle failure finally forced him back into 6th position. When racing resumed after World War I Louis was honoured by driving and building the first American race car to win the 500 mile classic since 1912.

In 1920 and following years Chevrolet built racers were showing their supremacy over the once European dominated race tracks, but Louis, like many others, discovered that building limited sale racing cars was a hard way to make money.

His business associations with American automobile manufacturers began in 1911, when William Durant, a wheeling-and-dealing corporation executive, brought Louis Chevrolet into the business to build a medium-priced car. Chevrolet's name, famous from his racing exploits, was attached to the car he supervised the design and construction of.





The first Chevy was a six-cylinder model. It was discontinued shortly after its release and the name "Chevrolet" was transferred to another car, originally called the "Little", built by the Republic Motor Co., which Durant had bought.

Durant, busy putting together an industrial empire, and Chevrolet, interested more in building cars than corporations, came to a parting of the ways in 1915. Chevrolet, the man, went on to continue his racing career and to start a speed equipment business for hotting up T-model Fords. Chevrolet, the company, as part of General Motors, was by then experiencing tremendous success.

1916 saw the production of the model 490 (so called because it sold for \$490) which was continued through to 1929. Powered by a four cylinder overhead valve engine. A willing plugger, and even capable of being modified into something a little more potent, it did not attract the enthusiasm of the speed fanciers. They devoted their time to the Model T, and later, the Model A. For these cars Louis Chevrolet had produced custom double overhead-cam hot-up cylinder heads.

This engine displaced 194 cubic inches and in many ways resembled the Four (such as identical valves). The most significant feature of the six was the material from which the head, block and pistons were made and the source of the nickname "The Cast Iron Wonder".

The Six, in slightly altered forms, survived the depression, a World War and into the age of jet aircraft and atomic bombs. It was the staple of the Chevrolet line right up to the mid-fifties.

In 1930, when the tide of depression turned, Chevrolet lost only half as many sales as Ford in the depressed market. Chevrolet took over sales leadership, to loose it again only in 1935, 1957 and 1959.

Major body changes occurred in 1937 and again in 1941, the latter marking the disappearance of running boards; headlights also sank into the mudguards. By now Chevy was a much more modern car than Ford, the latter having only the V-8 engine in its favour — and it actually developed only 5 hp more than the "Blue Flame" 6.

Other notable milestones were the Corvettes of 1953 built in Flint and planned to have only the first 300 prototypes in fibreglass. 1955 saw the rebirth of the Chevrolet V8, the now celebrated small block. From 1955 to the current models saw Chevrolet heavily involved in model diversification and the options game. In 1959 came the El Camino Utility, 1960 the Corvair, 1962 the Chevy II, 1967 the Camaro and in 1970 the Monte Carlo.

There you have it — an outline of Chevrolet, the man behind the name, and the car that lived up to the name — an innovative leader in its field.



## Bevan Joseph's 1968 Chevrolet Impala



I would like to introduce you to our Secretary, and all round top guy, Bevan Joseph and his 1968 Chevrolet Impala. Bevan has been one of the driving forces behind the scenes of the '567 Chev Club for many years now. To say his love for the club runs deep is an understatement. Likewise does his passion for his prized Impala.

Growing up, Bevan used to go for a ride in the neighbours Impala. This Impala was driven from the Northern Beaches to Grenfell in country NSW, with the family pet bird in the back seat most of its life. At the age of 90, the lady owner passed away. Not long after, the husband approached Bevan and said, "here are the keys to your car"!. It was 2009 and it had just 55,000 original miles on it!







Bevan drove the car for 4-5 years before he could finally convince his good friend, and also Club Member, Garry Wright to help with a complete refurbishment.

Garry then enlisted the help of fellow car guru and club member Chris Lowger. Between the three of them, the car was dismantled, painted and had all the mechanicals completely reconditioned/rebuilt. It was then reassembled and reupholstered, all within 5 months!





Since then, Bevan has travelled over 20,000 trouble free miles all around the country. Along the way he celebrated his 60th Birthday in style with this awesome Impala birthday cake (middle right pic) thanks to his partner in crime Flora.



With lots of more miles planned in the future, I am sure Bevan, Flora and his Impala are up for the trip.

#### HISTORIC AND CONDITIONAL (MODIFIED) REGISTRATION

#### HISTORIC AND CONDITIONAL (MODIFIED) REGISTRATION INCLUDING 60 DAY LOG BOOK

To be eligible for historic & conditional registration you must be a member of an RMS approved automotive car club such as ours. Membership of our club is \$80 per annum.

Historic and conditional registrations are both eligible for the 60 day log book trial. The trial allows you to drive your vehicle on 60 individual days at your own discretion. Cub events and club sanction runs do not impact on the 60 day log book use.

Fees for concessional registration are set by the RMS & are currently \$51 for registration including green slip plus a once off payment of \$40 for new plates. Conditional registration also attracts an additional annual fee of \$25 to the ACMC.

Personalised plates need to be surrendered, transferred, or placed on hold; the latter attracts a holding fee & any other ongoing rental costs. It is hoped that the RMS may allow personalised plates with conditional registration sometime in the future.

Historic registration (H Plate) is essentially for vehicles 30 years or older that have not been modified, some consideration maybe allowed for manufacture/dealer approved accessories, Limited safety upgrades and unavailability of original parts. In our club registration requires an annual Pink Slip.

Conditional registration (D Plate) is also available for vehicles 30 years or older that have been modified. The RMS have issued a set of guidelines (VSI No.6) that address many examples of what modifications may or may not require certification by an RMS certified engineer. For example an engine capacity increase greater than 20% or a total wheel and tyre diameter increase by more than 7% would require certification. Modified vehicles that do not need certification must have a once off Blue Slip, than an annual Pink Slip. Vehicles requiring certification require an engineer's report confirming the current modifications plus a Blue Slip, than an annual Pink Slip.

Please refer to the overleaf flow chart for further guidance and feel free to contact one of our three Plate Registrars for more information.



#### The 55'56'57' Chevrolet Club Of Australia Inc. Process for conditional registration schemes

Regardless of whether you are renewing or applying for the first time for Historic or Classic vehicle registration before you precede you must be a financial member of the Club, live in N.S.W. and hold current NSW drivers licence, the vehicle must be garaged in NSW

Thoroughly read all of the Roads and maritime services (RMS) rules pertaining to the conditional scheme to determine if your vehicle complies with their requirements that suit your vehicle check RMS web site. There are two conditional registration schemes that apply to our cars One is Historic vehicle scheme (HVS) Or two Classic vehicle scheme (CVS) vehicles must be 30 years old as per build date,



- Thoroughly read the 55'56'57' Chevrolet Club of Australia Inc. Conditional registration rules pertaining club registration.
- 2. Sign form from plate's registrar that you have read and understand the club rules.
