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


Also, Cars Under the Stars seems to have found a regular home at Luddenham Showgrounds.



42ND NATIONAL CHEVROLET FESTIVAL Forster/Tuncurry NSW

Entrants must have a Registered vehicle and it must have a Chevrolet Compliance plate or an Australian compliance plate for Chevrolet vehicles assembled in Australia. Other GM products are not eligible.

This event will be held between the 21st September - 24th September 2018.

...Entry forms are expected to be available early March after all council requirements have been met.

Entrant Entry will cover 1 or 2 cars (same owner) and 2 Adults and their immediate children under 16. Any child over 12 will be charged adult meal cost.

Pre Entries \$55 will close last mail 2nd August 2018. All pre entries will receive the National Chevrolet festival plaque and a goodie bag.

Entry on the day is \$55 but no plaque or goodie bag.

Wrestling with my 1957 Belair "RedBack" by John Keogh



I Love my 57, Loved it when I saw it, Loved it when I bought it... But driving it was always hard work and I had forgotten what driving a car with no aircon or power steering was like, hard bloody work at low speed, particularly when parking.

Getting into a 60-year-old car with no air-conditioning is one thing but no power steering was always going to be challenging. With the weight of a 502 Big Block engine and drop spindles on the front not to mention going from 4.5" wide tyres to 8" tyres on the front

So easy I thought I would get power steering installed and enjoy the little luxury of power-assisted steering. Plenty in the club are running with power steering and they love how their cars steer and turn with it.

My First Problem though, there was no room in this engine bay for POWER STEERING

So after a lot of research I decided to go down the path of Electric Power Steering, after all a lot of the new cars were going that way, and don't forget the benefit of less drag on the engine that has got to be worth a couple of horsepower

I researched a few companies that were making kits and settled on EPAS in the States thate were great to deal with and they made a kit for my 1957 Belair










I would love to say that I was up to the task of fitting this kit, but not a hope in hell was this in my skill range. But this is again where the benefit of our club comes into its own. We have some of the most helpful, knowledgeable and talented members and engineers going around. I spoke to Gary Wright and he was sceptical but interested enough to do his own research and came back to me a few days later and said he would like to give it a go. Awesome was my response...

So the kit was ordered and came via snail mail ...

Now the true art of any installation is how can you make it look factory. Well Gary Wright and his newly enlisted "apprentice Chris Lowger" did a fantastic job as the photos below show.

Dennis Gaya of Sebastopol, California, is the owner of this restomod beauty, and he's had the Bel Air for just shy of ten years. "I purchased the car from a friend that inherited it from his grandfather who was the original owner," Dennis said. "It sat in his back yard for 10 years before I could talk him into selling it to me. The car was full of rust and you could see the ground through the floor." While Dennis knew it was going to be a big project, that did not deter him. He brought the Bel Air home and assessed what needed done. "I decided to remove the body and perform a total frame-off restoration," Dennis said. He found that the frame had been bent in an accident years ago in addition to the rust and usual disrepair of a car that has been sitting for a decade. Although it looks great now, the project started with a rusty body and a bent frame. A lot of time, money, and love has gone into fixing this beauty! The next step in the process is what most car guys dream of. "In 2011, I went to the SEMA show in Las Vegas with a wallet full of credit cards," Dennis explained. "I shopped for two days, buying all of the major components." He went through the show and picked out all the parts he wanted to include in his hot rod build. He started with a complete, Art Morrison chassis, Wilwood disc brakes, a Rick's Tanks 20-gallon fuel tank, and Budnik wheels. Dennis also selected an impressive drivetrain, opting to use a Mast Motorsports LS3 engine, TCI six-speed automatic transmission, and a Strange 9-inch rearend. Dennis finished things off with a Budnik steering wheel, Vintage Air A/C, Classic Instruments gauges, and an Infinity Box electrical management system. Once he finished shopping at SEMA, it was time to get home and start building his car. "Pieces starts showing up awhile the body was on a rotisserie getting cleaned," Dennis said. It was getting new floor pans, mini tubs in the rear, and all of the other rust repair that it needed. After the body work was done, it was coated in epoxy primer, and the body was taken off the rotisserie to be test fit on the new frame. Satisfied with the merger, he took the body back off, and the frame and suspension went for powdercoating. A car doesn't come to look like this over night! Years of sweat equity and elbow grease went into getting this Bel Air show ready! After several months of bodywork, the Bel Air went to one of Dennis' friend's house for final sanding and painting. While the paintwork was in progress, the frame was being fit with all of the running gear. "Once the painting was finished, the body was bolted to the frame for the fifth and final time," Dennis said. Assembly took another two years, and the car went off to the upholstery shop for finishing touches. "The interior was custom fabricated using Cadillac seats, custom made rear seats, door panels, console, and headliner," Dennis said.

The color Dennis used for the upholstery works great with the exterior red, and is absolutely beautiful! The Bel Air's interior also features a smooth dash with custom gauges, cruise control, paddle shifters, electric windows and door locks, a security system, and a nine-speaker sound system. All of the electronics are controlled by a mini iPad in the console. The car may have the look and style of a 60-year-old car, but it has every convenience of a modern luxury vehicle.

Since completion, the Bel Air has been driven 5,000 miles and attended many shows over the last two years. "She is a real joy to drive and handles like a modern high-performance vehicle," Dennis said. "The car started out to be a restoration, but turned into a custom build. There is just too much hot-rodding in my blood." It took a total of 8-years to build the car, but it was worth it. "Thank god I have a forgiving wife," Dennis said. "Now that I'm approaching 70 years old, this is the last car I will build. Now it's time to see the

HISTORIC AND CONDITIONAL (MODIFIED) REGISTRATION

HISTORIC AND CONDITIONAL (MODIFIED) REGISTRATION INCLUDING 60 DAY LOG BOOK

To be eligible for historic & conditional registration you must be a member of an RMS approved automotive car club such as ours. Membership of our club is \$50 per annum.

Historic and conditional registrations are both eligible for the 60 day log book trial. The trial allows you to drive your vehicle on 60 individual days at your own discretion. Cub events and club sanction runs do not impact on the 60 day log book use.

Fees for concessional registration are set by the RMS & are currently \$51 for registration including green slip plus a once off payment of \$40 for new plates. Conditional registration also attracts an additional annual fee of \$25 to the ACMC.

Personalised plates need to be surrendered, transferred, or placed on hold; the latter attracts a holding fee & any other ongoing rental costs. It is hoped that the RMS may allow personalised plates with conditional registration sometime in the future.

Historic registration (H Plate) is essentially for vehicles 30 years or older that have not been modified, some consideration maybe allowed for manufacture/dealer approved accessories, Limited safety upgrades and unavailability of original parts. In our club registration requires an annual Pink Slip.

Conditional registration (D Plate) is also available for vehicles 30 years or older that have been modified. The RMS have issued a set of guidelines (VSI No.6) that address many examples of what modifications may or may not require certification by an RMS certified engineer. For example an engine capacity increase greater than 20% or a total wheel and tyre diameter increase by more than 7% would require certification. Modified vehicles that do not need certification must have a once off Blue Slip, than an annual Pink Slip. Vehicles requiring certification require an engineer's report confirming the current modifications plus a Blue Slip, than an annual Pink Slip.



The 55'56'57' Chevrolet Club Of Australia Inc. Process for conditional registration schemes

Regardless of whether you are renewing or applying for the first time for Historic or Classic vehicle registration before you precede you must be a financial member of the Club, live in N.S.W. and hold current NSW drivers licence, the vehicle must be garaged in NSW

Thoroughly read all of the Roads and maritime services (RMS) rules pertaining to the conditional scheme to determine if your vehicle complies with their requirements that suit your vehicle check RMS web site. There are two conditional registration schemes that apply to our cars One is Historic vehicle scheme (HVS) Or two Classic vehicle scheme (CVS) vehicles must be 30 years old as per build date,








