



It was fully imported from Canada where I think G M had a plant to make right hand drive cars for export. I have been told that is correct.

Since then it has been part of the family and if I every talk about selling it I know I would be asked to leave the house.

I realise that it is not a show car it is just a lovely old Chev which has brought us a lot of pleasure and will continue to do so.

'GOSFORD CLASSIC CARS' CLOSES



The Central Coast's most unique car dealership, Gosford Classic Cars, is set to close following a protracted dispute with the ATO.

The dealership was set up in 2016, to be Australia's biggest classic car dealership, creating a point of interest for people on the Central Coast, a sense of pride among the local community, stimulation of the local economy and many jobs.

Having consulted PricewaterhouseCoopers, a leading law firm, and after receiving indications from the ATO itself that the structure and entity fully complied with Australian taxation rules, the dealership has been caught up in protracted discussions with the ATO since 2016. The dispute centres around whether Gosford Classic Cars is entitled to the same taxation exemptions as other motor dealerships. The business has always cooperated with the ATO, diligently meeting its taxation obligations in full, and on time. In keeping with that (and despite their strong objection to the ATO's position) Gosford Classic Cars implemented all interim measures suggested by the ATO, immediately upon the ATO suggesting them.

As a consequence, the dealership has not been able to market its trading business in the unique way which has made it successful as a dealership in the past. This has resulted in a significant loss in sales revenue, with car sales reducing from up to 59 car sales per month to as low as just 5 per month.

The ATO's measures were expected to be implemented on a temporary basis. However, 12 months on and more than 2 years since the ATO's ongoing audit commenced, those measures remain in place.

Without a conclusive answer from the ATO on why the benefits available to other motor dealerships are not accessible to the our dealership and given the expected lengthy timeframes for resolving disputes via litigation, the dealership cannot continue to sustain these trading losses and has decided to close its doors.

This decision has not been made easily. With the closure of the business comes the loss of over 40 jobs and the opportunity for significant additional employment offered by what was to be the region's most significant commercial development: the Central Coast Council approved 7-storey, eco-friendly building at its West Gosford site, which it had intended to use for auto-related businesses, to act as the Australian base for specialist international auction houses, and a call centre. The business plan for this envisaged the creation of more than 200 jobs on the Central Coast. Unfortunately, those plans were put on ice as soon as the ATO's initial opinion was provided.

"In a region where youth unemployment is above the national average, this represents a substantial economic loss for the region and a missed opportunity" says Gosford Classic Cars manager, Jason Fischer. "The factors that set us apart from most used-car dealerships meant that the business was well loved in the region. This is a major loss for the Central Coast".

Gosford Classic Cars has now officially closed and the stock is to be sold in a (predominantly) no-reserve auction organised by Lloyds Auction House, on 6-7 April 2019.

The West Gosford premises are also on the market to be sold.

Greg Burtons 4dr Bel Air Hardtop

We are the third owners and have had the car for about 8 years. The previous owner bought it with approximately 8000 miles on the speedo in 1959. The current reading is just over 65000 miles. The car was involved in a minor accident in the early 60's and the technology of those days didn't allow for an exact colour match. Thence the car was repaired and a doors on resprayed, a close match but to an experience eye the difference can be seen.

The car was built in Canada as a right hand drive and is original apart from a set of air horns. The front seat and doors are still covered with the original plastic, and the spare (although bald was an original tyre). Current tyres are Goodyear Double Eagle Whitewalls. The paint work is in great condition thanks to regular polishing with the good old REPO in the little brown bottle.

The car is fitted with a tow bar as it was used to tow their speed boat to Windsor for the Bridge to Bridge. There are 2 small Kenwood rubber wheels in the boat that were attached when the car was being driven on the punts. A great accessory as it save the bumpers from dragging on the punt's ramps.

Since I have started working on the vehicle the fuel tank, petrol pump and fuel sender have been replaced. All brake wheel cylinders, master cylinder hoses and brake booster renewed or overhauled. The radiator unfortunately had to be replaced last month but I was able to source a new copper and brass unit out of the States.

The door rubbers are looking pretty ordinary and the 'J' rubbers on the front doors are also in need of replacement.

On 17th June 2015 Eldad migrated to New Zealand from Australia and established himself opening up Rotorua Motor Works.

HISTORIC AND CONDITIONAL (MODIFIED) REGISTRATION

HISTORIC AND CONDITIONAL (MODIFIED) REGISTRATION INCLUDING 60 DAY LOG BOOK

To be eligible for historic & conditional registration you must be a member of an RMS approved automotive car club such as ours. Membership of our club is \$80 per annum.

Historic and conditional registrations are both eligible for the 60 day log book trial. The trial allows you to drive your vehicle on 60 individual days at your own discretion. Cub events and club sanction runs do not impact on the 60 day log book use.

Fees for concessional registration are set by the RMS & are currently \$51 for registration including green slip plus a once off payment of \$40 for new plates. Conditional registration also attracts an additional annual fee of \$25 to the ACMC.

Personalised plates need to be surrendered, transferred, or placed on hold; the latter attracts a holding fee & any other ongoing rental costs. It is hoped that the RMS may allow personalised plates with conditional registration sometime in the future.

Historic registration (H Plate) is essentially for vehicles 30 years or older that have not been modified, some consideration maybe allowed for manufacture/dealer approved accessories, Limited safety upgrades and unavailability of original parts. In our club registration requires an annual Pink Slip.

Conditional registration (D Plate) is also available for vehicles 30 years or older that have been modified. The RMS have issued a set of guidelines (VSI No.6) that address many examples of what modifications may or may not require certification by an RMS certified engineer. For example an engine capacity increase greater than 20% or a total wheel and tyre diameter increase by more than 7% would require certification. Modified vehicles that do not need certification must have a once off Blue Slip, than an annual Pink Slip. Vehicles requiring certification require an engineer's report confirming the current modifications plus a Blue Slip, than an annual Pink Slip.


