

Members should confirm attendance so catering can be arranged. We had enough for the night and no left overs were taken home.







aylor Made

BOR-888 Chevrolet 210. Part 1 of 2.

I bought my Australian delivered, 1957 210 4 door sedan, 6 cylinder manual, on 6th March 1986 with 102,260 miles on the clock.BOR-888 (B8) came from the deceased estate off a gentleman I worked with on occasions. After his passing I contacted his son in law about buying the car. We agreed on a price, but the word got out and I eventually secured it at the greatly inflated price of \$2850. Bill's family told me I was the 4th owner. The previous 3 being from Strathfield, Homebush, and Bill from Earlwood. I believe B8 has never been out of rego, the plates are the originals and never remade. It was original apart from front seat belts, windscreen washers and radio. Even had GM factory air in the Dunlop B7 cross ply spare.



I met a club member at the old Bargo Swap meet who told me about the club. I joined the 55 56 57 Chevrolet Club of Australia at the May 1986 meeting. Members were sitting on tables in a ring around a few chairs in the centre. Most members were roughly in their mid-30's, similar to now except most of us are roughly in our mid-60's. As I'd given up the coffin nails in 1982, I was disappointed to find smoking was a mandatory option at the Peakhurst Community Hall. A cuppa tea and some Ice Vo Vo's went down well at the meeting's end. The odd hoon would do a burnout as he left the car park of the closed servo next door. Lucky there was no grog on site. Only 3 members and 2 cars are left from that era.

About once a year we had an auction night. Unwanted parts changed hands at very reasonable prices. Chris C was the entertaining auctioneer. I had a few of his pre loved diffs until recently. As they had too many teeth missing they ended up in a scrap metal yard.

Almost immediately I repaired the starter motor (we had to clutch start it along Homer St. on pick up) and gearshift linkages. The front wheel bearings were shot so I went straight to HQ disc's, callipers, HT booster etc, from Dollar Wall's at Chipping Norton, and overhauled the rear brakes. HZ 6" wheels were modified to suit the original 210 hub caps (dog dish as they say in the USA) and steel radials added. HG rear seat belts and the girl's child booster seats installed. Front belts changed to match. A front end rebuild, wheel alignment and a set of H4's were next. Man it was like driving a Cadillac.





A Holden red alternator, water, fuel pump, and a WW Stromberg and air cleaner of a 253 came next. The original gearbox was reconditioned, new clutch, rear shocks, shackles and unis. Over the next few thousand miles I went through a bit of a gear box phase, seems a bit silly now. First was a HG 3 speed, next a 3 speed Muncie out of Filthy's V8 52 Ute, which went to Mick G for his 56 hard top. Then a backwards step to a HQ V8 Aussie 3 speed, which ended up in Eric's 55 from down Wagga Wagga way.

New red and white trim, hood lining, and carpet close to original were next.

All under car rubbers and a coat of GM Black were next. Rust repairs in 2 doors, bottoms of front guards and minor panel work followed. All floors were as new.

A back yard bare metal respray using very close to the original colour (Cuban Beige) was next. Very little new rust was found. Interior red paint was also done. A new front windscreen and new rubbers plus door rubbers and new bailey channels were fitted.



Around 1994 I bought a fan to tail shaft 350 mouse and Turbo 400 out of a burnt out HQ. The melted Holley and singed Malory twin point dizzy were a sure sign as to where the fire started. Luckily the now sought after Corvette finned alloy rocker covers were not damaged.

A set of rings and bearings, the heads cleaned up, Chevy Orange engine paint, a bit of bling and the old clunker was ready for a new life. It was mated to a reconditioned Powerglide from a HK Brougham. The old Blue flame went, via The Trading Post, into a 51 Chev Ute in Canberra. A big improvement over the old Stove Bolt 6 the happy new owner told me at the next Chev Festival.

The firewall and front end got a paint job before the new combo was installed. A Short but noisy trip, rams horns only, to the exhaust shop where a 2 into 1 system was installed. At last, my first Chev V8, 350 + 030" cubes, balanced, 4 bolt block, double hump fuelies, (as sung about by Bruce Springsteen in "Racing in the street") with 2.02" in and 1.60" ex valves and port work. Over many years I also went through a carburettor phase, several Q Jets', Holley's 750 vac 2nds, 600 square bore, spread bore, big spacer, little spacer and a 650 double pumper which is the current one. Great carbie, providing you don't stomp on it like you are killing a cock roach.

HISTORIC AND CONDITIONAL (MODIFIED) REGISTRATION

HISTORIC AND CONDITIONAL (MODIFIED) REGISTRATION INCLUDING 60 DAY LOG BOOK

To be eligible for historic & conditional registration you must be a member of an RMS approved automotive car club such as ours. Membership of our club is \$80 per annum.

Historic and conditional registrations are both eligible for the 60 day log book trial. The trial allows you to drive your vehicle on 60 individual days at your own discretion. Cub events and club sanction runs do not impact on the 60 day log book use.

Fees for concessional registration are set by the RMS & are currently \$51 for registration including green slip plus a once off payment of \$40 for new plates. Conditional registration also attracts an additional annual fee of \$25 to the ACMC.

Personalised plates need to be surrendered, transferred, or placed on hold; the latter attracts a holding fee & any other ongoing rental costs. It is hoped that the RMS may allow personalised plates with conditional registration sometime in the future.

Historic registration (H Plate) is essentially for vehicles 30 years or older that have not been modified, some consideration maybe allowed for manufacture/dealer approved accessories, Limited safety upgrades and unavailability of original parts. In our club registration requires an annual Pink Slip.

Conditional registration (D Plate) is also available for vehicles 30 years or older that have been modified. The RMS have issued a set of guidelines (VSI No.6) that address many examples of what modifications may or may not require certification by an RMS certified engineer. For example an engine capacity increase greater than 20% or a total wheel and tyre diameter increase by more than 7% would require certification. Modified vehicles that do not need certification must have a once off Blue Slip, than an annual Pink Slip. Vehicles requiring certification require an engineer's report confirming the current modifications plus a Blue Slip, than an annual Pink Slip.




